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NOTICE NEW POLICY FOR GUESTS

Guests are required to REGISTER in the "GUEST BOOK", at the Clubhouse, as they enter the Campground. This is to improve Security and provide the Management Team emergency info.

FISHING RESERVOIR RULES (REMINDER)

- 1. Adults must have a Permit in your possession.

 Permit valid only for person to whom issued.
- 2. No boats, float tubes, wadding or swimming.
- 3. No horse trailers or horses inside fence. Fisherman parking only.
- 4. No fires or overnight camping.
- 5. Guests must be accompanied by property owner or immediate family member.
- 6. No pole holders or digging allowed.
- 7. Maximum of four fish per person per day.
- 8. Pets must be on leash and under control of its owner at all times.
- 9. Ice fishing is not allowed.

Permits are available from the Manager.

MAIL SERVICE AT CAMPGROUND

Each member is responsible for making their own arrangements with the Postal service.

The Management Team has been directed, by the Board of Directors, to refrain from handling any mail other than the CORA's Official Business Mail that is delivered to the Associations mail box. Mail, other than official business, delivered to P.O.Box 125 in Fairplay, will be rejected.

The Board determined that this restriction is necessary to protect the Association's assets from liability in the event of a Law Suit arising from a claim of loss or mishandling of U.S.Mail.

We have used money from the Real Estate account to pay these costs in order to avoid a dues increase.

The Board is going to have to take a hard look at our past practices and what we need to do to keep our Association in the excellent financial condition we now enjoy.

We have been very aggressive in pursuing the collection of Dues, fees and penalties due the Association because this is the source of funds for the Operating Account.

We have not had an increase in our dues in over seven years but the time may be near.
