We have decided to get serious about putting together a CORA Cookbook. We will be using Morris



A trap was set it Silverton Northern and one bear was trapped. The bear was taken about 3 miles west of the campground and released. The bear came immediately back to the campground and continued feeding in the trash bins. The Division of Wildlife told CORA folks to take down all hummingbird and seed feeders since they felt that those things might be attracting bears or they would be fined \$1,000. CORA management has requested Bear-proof trash containers from CSS, the trash company and we are waiting for their arrival.





Gate Code Changed

Gate Code will be changed on an annual basis beginning January 2008 and each year thereafter. The notification will be mailed with the Assessment Bill. This was changed so that we can put a new control box replacing the old one that was struck by lighting and destroyed. It was much cheaper to have the same gate code for everyone then to have individual codes.



Regarding real

estate: If you are planning on selling your property or quit claim

deeding it to a relative without using a Title Company, please be aware of two things. 1. There is a \$35.00 transfer fee due to CORA to properly record the transfer, which merely covers the administrative time involved. 2. If you have electric on your lot, you need to advise your buyer that the electric is only billed once a year and work out an arrangement with your buyer. When a Title Company is used, we collect the minimum usage charge of \$27.54 for the year from the seller. However, for those with individual electric, if you have been using your site, obviously the expense will be greater. If you have any questions, I'm just a phone call (or e-mail) away! Thanks
