

### **Activities of the Board**

Your CORA Board held its last meeting at the Campground, which was attended by a surprisingly large number of members (I counted 38 folks in attendance). At this time, the Board decided to conduct at least 7 (April through October) meetings at the Campground, to make it easier for members to be involved. Future meeting dates are:

The managers' house is in need of a new roof; proposals are being solicited and reviewed. The cost will be in the range of \$2800-3500. New track lighting has been installed in the clubhouse (by Jim Wheiles) and has added a great deal to the amount of light available. A new intercom system was installed for the gate, and is working well (the old system died). The water pump for Silverton Northern was also replaced after it, too, died.

Two groups within the Facilities Committee have been set up to insure compliance with the directives involving the repair of concrete slabs, electrical connections, sewer connections, and fire pits. These groups got crackin' early in July.

#### Managers Leave; Managers Hired

Wayne and Eva have submitted their resignation, to take effect no later than September 13. Since their original notice, the new managers have been interviewed and hired, so the Lundstroms will be leaving on July 15 (@ 6 AM!!!!).

A very heartfelt *Thanks* was expressed at the Board meeting for what they have done for the Campground.

They will begin their new duties on August 1, after they complete assistant manager responsibilities at another RV campground.

#### **Budget Committee**

The Board will consider this budget earlier this next year than in past years, so that planning can be conducted in a more timely fashion. It appears that some of the key functions of managing the Campground, such as the budget, are starting to involve a broader representation of members, which is much needed.

#### **Real Estate**

There are 4 DSP and 24 Silverton Northern lots remaining in the CORA-owned inventory. There are as many private lots for sale, and all prices are competitive for both CORA and the area.

Lots are selling well, particularly since the Campground is looking so good right now. Paul Pierce, Real Estate Committee Chair, thanked all members for keeping their lots clean and mowed.

Pierce further asked members to remember to let Nola Strnad know at our accounting firm's office if you sell your lot. There is a transfer fee of \$35, plus addresses and entry codes need to be changed after a sale. You'll find the proper address and phone number on the return address of the *Hummer*.

#### Notice

Members are reminded that effective July 1, 1998, the use of direct connections to the sewer system with 'slinky type hoses' will require an approved adapter. This will prevent the possibility of losing hoses into the underground system and will assist in reducing sewer gas emissions. (The managers have a sample. This is a "Universal Sewer Connector" available at most RV parts stores.)

Please take care of this if you haven't done so already. When a 'slinky' disappears into the sewer system, it blocks it, which costs a great deal to

unplug.

Further, some guests have been mis-led by a member, to believe that everything in the clubhouse is free. *This is not true!!* 

Food such as popsicles, donuts, etc. are provided as a convenience, and have a cost attached. The coffee is free; however, donations are appreciated since stocks must be replenished.
