- d. Loren Eckhardt CS47 Trail Boss permission to ride my Coleman trail bike on trail. He would like to provide a new trail head and main trial. Asking the Board if they would purchase a new chain saw to maintain trail. Asking CORA to sponsor the trail and caps (approximate cost of \$500.00). Suggesting that CORA design a flag of their own. There will be a need to install a flag pole and cost of flag. Flag would be hung

Explained to take the pressure off from the Board, she suggests that we ask CCIOA make the ruling and suggesting changes of the broken bylaws and covenants so that CORA Board will be free of criticism from the community members.

#### H. FACILITIES REPORT

John Ludivig SN196/197

Clubhouse painting and uplift. (see attached expense breakdown)

Pool: Turnbuckles cleaned, screens repaired and replaced, new hardware on doors, robot pool vacuum purchased, pool reel cover purchased.

Cameras: Temporary cameras installed in office, pool, clubhouse, and propane area.

Service Centers: All cleaned and ready for new summer season, light switch sensors installed in all, all bulletin boards updated, new signs posted throughout.

Roads: Remainder of road base applied, all roads now complete, mag chloride also applied throughout.

New computer purchased for office. New configuration of office to better serve owners.

Fire inspection done by Cintas, all fire extinguishers have been hung, looking at replacing about 6 next vear.

Sewer: Issues have included pool restrooms, electrical panel was fixed for sewer system, took out and reinstalled sump pump in sewer system.

Workcampers secured for new season.

Steps to clubhouse built, now both sides new and safe.

New water heater installed in caretaker's house.

In addition, daily duties fulfilled to maintain CORA. A huge Thank You to Tom and Jane Tingle, our new caretakers, for all jobs well done. They are an asset to CORA.

Water: Shutdown last fall and startup this spring was successfully accomplished. This is a major process to ensure safe water for all owners. State water inspection was done, the rules and regulations for this are becoming stricter. Thank you to Tim Zingler, our "water man" that serves CORA endlessly. We passed the inspection with flying colors.

WIFI – needs to be updated and further research and consideration of additional cost

Gate- if there is an electronic card all owners would be issued 2 cards there would be a \$500.00 replacement fee.

Marge Pierce DSP16—Suggested someone sitting at the gate marking owners and registered guest into community.

Paul Pierce DSP16—Suggested that a good start with controlling the gate would be to frequently change the code.

Kay Greenlee SN186 - suggested gate code change be included in the July mailing.

Marlene Jones SN293 – mentioned to give community members a perspective of burn pile – During the most resent burn pile dig out - 33,000 lbs. of debris was removed from the pile and this costs community members.

Entrance into CORA has become a very serious problem and possible problem with theft issues in the community. Board will investigate gate options to present to community.

#### a. RULES AND REGULATIONS

Linda Childs SN168—Introduced the changes to attending community members. Following suggestions and concerns to rules and regulations from attending CORA members:

Betty Vaughn DSP53&54- Permit includes call this number.

Frank Salvador SN289/290— Concerned with number of sheds on property. John explained that it would be best if Frank would complete a compliant form.

Marlene Jones SN293 - Note no use of CORA water.

Sue - No weekend reservation of clubhouse. Board explained that she can bring family in to use clubhouse during weekend and use. Kay suggested checking calendar prior to using the clubhouse on the weekend.

Marlene Jones SN293 – Use of the word of "any" and "all" concerning transportation Don – All modes of transportation should be used only by a licensed driver.

Doug Vaughn DSP53&54- Change "any" - the mode of transportation used by a licensed driver.

Frank Salvador SN289/290– Who do we tell if we see a violation of the rules – Linda – explained that a complaint would need to be filed by the community member.

Brandon Walker DSP081 – CORA's public roads should follow the law and motorized vehicles should only be operated by licensed drivers.

Mark Wiseman SN065 – Concerned with carry and concealed weapons – what if a person felt threatened by an animal/bear and shot the animal? John – explained that there is a great possibility of county fine.

John Ludivig SN196/197– Explained that Park County ruling concerning the 6-month rule/permit resident rule.

Carol Clark DSP100— Questioning that the covenants use to state NO renting and explanation of permanent residency in CORA. Kay – noted the dialogue in the August 2016 Homeowners Association Documents – 6.1.3 Use and occupancy of Lots shall not be for a permanent residence, except within zoning allowed for that use and with the written approval of the Association

Betty Vaughn DSP53&54 – Concerned with whom is taking care of the sewer problems. John Ludivig SN196/197 – explained that we are going to keep it up and running hopefully through the season and take care of problem during the fall. Betty and Doug stated a concern with the upper sewer that there is vapor backed up gas smell. John – will check out the situation and see if more maintenance is needed.
