 - i. Said Tingles did a wonderful job and did everything text book based off of her previous work with FEMA and disaster services.
 - ii. Need some sort of notification system throughout CORA to reduce needing to knock on doors
 - Expected Board of Directors to support Tingles and have a more active role on CORA Folks during forest fire
 - 1. Brandon Walker -- Commented that Tingles are employed to interface with CORA owners in times like the forest fire

 - ii. Don't understand how anyone came in during mandatory evacuation even

 Care Takers to clean
 - 1. John Ludivig Said everyone left
 - 2. Jane Tingle
 - Informed everyone that officials allowed Tom and her to come in only to the house and office
 - After that Tingles talked with Officials to allow work campers and water guy (Tim) to come in and prep CORA to get facilities ready for the return of CORA owners
 - c. Fire fighters drained our wells, so all water supplies were required to be retested prior to use
 - 3. Sandra The information/insight Jane provided should have been sent out to help mitigate the negativity on CORA Folks
 - iii. Didn't need negativity on CORA Folks
- e. Loren Woods, DSP 10 Informed he was available to answer questions about hiking trail proposal
- f. Jim Windham, SN80 Stated rules/request regarding forest fire were which were stated on CORA Folks, were confusing in regards to what was coming from CORA and what was coming from forest fire officials
- g. Paul Pierce, DSP16
 - i. Thank you to everyone for helping take care of metal pile
 - ii. Metal pile will continue, looking for way to help compensate through pay/donation/contribution, Mr. Art (guy who takes out the metal pile)
 - 1. Randy Winterboer Stated the fence was around the burn pit was to keep people from dumping without approval? Insinuating we should have a fence around the metal pile.
 - a. Meeting Attendee There isn't a fence around metal dump
 - 2. Meeting Attendee (Bruce) Stated appreciation for John helping to get rid of the metal pile
 - 3. Kay Greenlee Stated the metal guy makes an income from the metal
- E. MINUTES OF JUNE 9, 2018
 - a. Brandon Walker Motioned to approve Minutes
 - b. Randy Winterboer Seconded
- F. TREASURER'S REPORT Linda Childs
 - a. Linda Childs Discussion
 - i. We should possibly look at solar power

- ii. Contacted a company
- iii. Meeting Attendee Suggested to contact power company
- b. John Ludivig Motioned to approve Treasurer's Report
- c. Kay Greenlee Seconded
- G. COLLECTIONS REPORT Joyce Derby
 - a. We are almost to the end of the collections
 - b. Collected over \$17K from back collections
- H. FACILITIES REPORT John Ludivig
 - a. Thank you to camp workers for help in June
 - b. Sewer Repairs
 - There was a malfunction at the sewer plant which was fixed panel and blower motor to be replaced
 - ii. Blue boy tank covers in the sewer pipe backed up line repairs cost \$1700
 - iii. Pool bathroom drains back up
 - 1. Cameras show pipes are falling apart/collapsing
 - 2. Sewer pipes have settled to low under driveway
 - 3. Hopefully get through summer and then need to fix (major)
 - c. General maintenance/repairs
 - i. Painted clubhouse, fixed decks, fixed vending machine at service center A on top
 - d. Corral Repair Roof was blown off from wind burst in June repairs are in progress
 - e. Loren Eckhardt is going to buy/install flag pole at top of Trail 47
 - f. Propane Contract is expiring (new business)
 - i. Contract with AmeriGas expires 1Aug AmeriGas increase from \$1.66 to \$1.76/gal
 - ii. Contacted Farrell Gas -- bid of \$1.55/gal (~\$300 saving per month) (\$1.55 first year, second year up to 8% increase)
 - 1. Will replace tanks for free, \$25/year rent tank (AmeriGas \$80/year)
 - iii. If we change, AmeriGas will come get old tanks
 - iv. Meeting Attendee What happens to remaining gas in tank?
 - 1. John Ludivig Believe Farrell Gas will transfer
 - g. Gate Code (new business)
 - i. It's been a long time since it was changed, need to change to help prevent theft, etc
 - ii. \$200 to change gate code. John Ludivig believes we can change it ourselves
 - iii. Requested a quote on a card entry system (~\$5000), proposed each lot would get 2 cards
 - 1. Meeting Attendee What is cost if we don't maintain the software which would come with new system?
 - 2. Meeting Attendee What about first responders?
 - 3. Meeting Attendee Would new system track lot owners coming in
 - 4. Meeting Attendee Could cards be used for entry in to facilities

- a. John Ludivig Haven't looked into that, could be discussed later
- 5. Meeting Attendee Will cards really prevent theft and vandalism?
- iv. Joyce Derby Asked if would provide new code in upcoming mailing?
 - John Ludivig Yes. New code effective maybe 1Sep.
- v. Meeting Attendee -- Requested change code more frequent
- h. Park County Rules (new business)
 - i. 2017 PC Changed Rules
 - 1. All lots need equipment to be 50ft from CORA property line Rule was objected to, went to court now 26ft (?)
 - 2. 2 Shed to 1 shed shed must be 5 ft. from property line
 - a. Existing sheds are grandfathered in
 - ii. Six month occupancy rule Owners can only occupy lot at CORA 6 months out of any 12 months
 - 1. No one is counting
 - a. PC doesn't know how to inforce rule PC basically said "We don't know."
 - iii. Meeting Attendee Stated they believe PC RV Park rules are due to squatters near Hartsel
- i. Propane devices are now allowed *(new business)* Allowance lines up with Park County fire burn regulations
 - i. Have to have a fire extinguisher next to all fire sources
 - ii. 5 gallons of water next to all non-propane fires
- I. COMMITTEE REPORTS
 - a. TECHNOLOGY John Rupprecht (assisted by John Robinson)
 - i. John Rupprecht will be leaving CORA
 - ii. WIFI issues
 - 1. This morning 24hr usage 28 GB, last 2 hrs. 4 GB
 - 2. Original system was put in to handle email, banking, small stuff
 - 3. 6 gateways 1x10 MB 5x5 MB
 - 4. CORA Net has reached max
 - 5. Observed 300+ users all at once once go over 200 users, system starts crashing
 - 6. Looking at alternatives
 - 7. Throttled back in Spring to standard definition speed
 - 8. 19 users during fire evacuation when no one was here
 - iii. WIFI possible future solution
 - 1. Individuals can get their own, has talked to companies, systems, etc.
 - 2. Contacted Dave Shipply about 100MB line could handle lower CORA, but would have a hard time serving canyon and top
 - iv. CORA Folks
 - 1. Read out loud the Notice on front page

- 2. 283 registered users
- 3. Talked about usage and that it seemed to work well during the forest fire
- 4. Noted good that it is independent of the board or CORA leaders
- Linda Childs Asked about the future of CORA Folks would like to find an owner/member to maintain CORA Folks after John leaves

 - 2. Suggested CORA name tags for owners
 - ii. Meeting Attendee Asked about fire fighter donations
 - 1. John Ludivig Was told to donate to local fire fighters
 - iii. Meeting Attendee Thank you to Jay Talley for doing the Thank You banners
- c. FINANCE COMMITTEE
 - i. To meet after budget committee concludes was interrupted by forest fire
 - ii. Considering possible committee name change
- d. BUDGET COMMITTEE Joyce Derby
 - i. Met Thursday, 12Jul
 - ii. Next meeting Monday, 16Jul
- e. COVENANTS COMMITTEE Doug Vaughn
 - i. Committee met in June
 - ii. Recommend no change to covenants
 - 1. Minor changes aren't worth the money to change covenants
 - iii. Linda Childs motioned to align Rules and Regs with covenants in regards to ATV usage within CORA
 - 1. Randy Winterboer disagreed Thinks all owners need to be present for vote
 - 2. Kay Greenlee Stated Rules and Regs are voted on by the board not the owners
 - 3. Meeting Attendee Wasn't ATV questionnaire just a questionnaire not a vote?
 - John Ludivig Stated questionnaire was not a vote and the addition of ATVs to the Rules and Regs was done incorrectly
 - 4. Meeting Attendee Covenants say no ATVs
 - 5. Kay Greenlee Mentioned that we should be more descriptive about licenses if we rescind the Rules and Regs
 - 6. Meeting Attendee UTVs can be licensed through the state of CO
 - 7. Meeting Attendee Everything driven on CORA should be licensed through the state

- Meeting Attendee (Marsha Ludivig) proper should be that we rescind Rules and Regs and then owners should vote to change covenants if needed
- 9. Meeting Attendee (Carol) Many people will be upset
- 10. Meeting Attendee (Marlene) There are very large legal issues if we break our covenants, thus the Rules and Regs need to align with the covenants

 - Mentioned scenario where CORA could be sued if someone is ran over or injured by an unlicensed vehicle if allowed in covenants/Rules and Regs.
